

Global University Schools of Medicine and Public Health (GU-MED), Turks & Caicos

Initial Provisional Accreditation Withdrawn

July 2015 Determination: *Initial Provisional Accreditation Withdrawn*

The CAAM-HP at its meeting held on July 23-25, 2015 discussed the progress reports of September 2014 and May 2015.

The decision was made to withdraw the Initial Provisional Accreditation as the meeting was not satisfied that critical areas had been addressed and that the school was ready to admit a charter class.

October 2014 Determination: *Initial Provisional Accreditation Reinstated*

The CAAM-HP, following on the Appeal by GU-MED, has taken the decision to reverse the withdrawal of initial provisional accreditation and reinstate that status with immediate effect.

CAAM-HP expects GU-MED to report on its readiness to admit its charter class by May 15, 2015. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in a withdrawal of the initial accreditation status and this without further consideration.

October 2013 Determination: *Initial Provisional Accreditation Withdrawn*

The CAAM-HP had not had any response to its requests for an update on progress in preparing to accept the charter class since granting initial provisional accreditation in August 2012. Therefore, the CAAM-HP, at its meeting held October 11-12, 2013, decided that the initial provisional accreditation be withdrawn.

August 2012 Determination: *Initial Provisional Accreditation*

The CAAM-HP having reviewed GU-MED's revised submissions along with the proposed facilities on Providenciales, has determined that the requirements for initial provisional accreditation have been met, with the proviso for a further visit to Providenciales before students are accepted at that site.

June 2010 Determination: *Initial Provisional Accreditation not granted*

The Global University Schools of Medicine and Public Health (GU-MED) submitted an application to the CAAM-HP for the establishment of a medical school on Providenciales, Turks & Caicos. The proposal was reviewed by external evaluators who submitted a report.

The CAAM-HP at its meeting held July 2-3, 2010 considered the application for the establishment of GU-MED and the reviewers' report.

The CAAM-HP after careful examination of the report determined that it could not grant initial provisional accreditation to the MD programme as major questions remained unanswered regarding programme and course descriptions as well as entry requirements.

The CAAM-HP therefore suggested that the proposal be rewritten.
